

Shooting Cowboy Long Range at Cascade Shooting Facilities

Directions to the Shooting Facility

Please follow the signs from Kent Kangley Road to Cascade Shooting Facilities (formerly Cascade Rifle & Pistol Club). You will travel approximately 1 mile on a gravel road once you turn off the pavement at the King County Shooting Park gate. Go past the Skeet & Trap facility and take the road to the right that goes to the south entrance. At the gate you will be greeted by our gatekeeper. He will give you directions to our 'D' range. Proceed through the gate, past the 'E' range that the Cascade Ghost Riders use to shoot their monthly cowboy matches on the 3rd Sunday of each month. There will be 4 storage buildings on the right. Travel past them to the first gravel road on your right after the buildings. You will need to drive 400 yards on this road to the 200 yard shelter where you may park. If the 300 yard firing line is active when driving in, you will be stopped temporarily at a barrier in the road until shooting is completed at that firing line and it is clear for you to proceed.

At the Range

- **DO NOT** remove your firearm from your vehicle until signed in & informed that you are cleared to do so by a range officer as we will be utilizing 3 different firing lines & absolutely **NO** firearm handling will be allowed while not the active shooter, except to retrieve from & return to your vehicle as directed by range officers.
- So that the safety officers can keep track of all firearms, **no gun carts** will be allowed on the range.
- Exit your vehicle and sign the release form that will be at the 200 yard shelter. You will need your vehicle license number on the form.
- After being told you are clear to retrieve your firearm(s) from your vehicle, please carry it muzzle up with the action open to one of the racks that will be under the shelter for your use.
- All persons will be required to use safety glasses & hearing protection while on the range, so please have them on before leaving your vehicle.

Sighting in and Shooting Procedures

- You will be asked what categories you would like to shoot in and arrangements will be made to accommodate you. Only one long distance rifle event is covered by your match fee. Any additional category over the initial one per each shooter will require a \$2 fee (to pay for the target) that will be collected in advance of your shooting. Please bring correct change in cash as we will not be able to facilitate giving change for large bills.
- All shooters, no matter what category, will be given a 3 minute sighting in period on a 'scrap' (not scored) target prior to your 10 shot scored shoot. You may do your own spotting, use a partner with or without a spotting scope (must be furnished by the shooter), or we can spot the shots by pulling the targets down from the pit after each shot, raising it with the marker for shooter's observation, then pulling the target & removing the 'marker' before raising it again for your next shot. Obviously the

raising/lowering will take more time & provide fewer rounds for the shooter to sight in, but is a highly visible option for you to consider.

- The 3 firing lines are mutually exclusive lines. Only one firing line will be active at any one time & no one will be allowed forward of the active line except our target spotter/puller personnel in the target pit.
- All shooters must adhere to instructions given by the range officers at all times. We will be trying to make sure that your experience at CSF is pleasant, but remember that everyone's safety is our primary concern. We will not tolerate any breach of our range officers' authority as they are responsible to ensure that shooters, spectators, and our neighbors are safe at all times. We will listen to complaints and/or suggestions, but the final decision will be left to the range officers in all cases.
- All targets will be brought to the 200 yard shelter by CSF personnel & available for viewing shortly after completion of each shooting session, but will be retained by CSF for official scoring by Westmatch directors later in the day. Shooters' targets will be available for retrieval by the shooter after the side match awards ceremony.
- No prone shooting.

Sights

- Front barrel sights may vary from simple blades to period hooded wind gauge designs using interchangeable sight inserts and having a spirit level mounted integral with the sight or sight base.
- Rear sights must either be open iron sights mounted on the barrel or original style tang or stock wrist mounted peep sights. Long range rear barrel mounted sights of the flip-up ladder type may use a peephole drilled through the sliding sight leaf. An example of this is the various ladder type sights used on the Springfield trapdoors.
- No optical sights are allowed.

Shooting Categories

- **Pistol Caliber Lever Action Rifle:** 10 Rounds. Shoot standing, off hand, with no rests. You will be shooting at a NMLRA buffalo paper target (TG2410) from the 100 yard temporary firing line that will be set up for this purpose.
- **Rifle Caliber:** 10 Rounds. Shooting sticks allowed. You will be shooting at a NMLRA bull's-eye paper target (TG2416) affixed to a life-size buffalo target holder from the 200 yard line under the shelter.
- **Rifle Caliber Single Shot:** 10 Rounds. Shooting sticks allowed. You will be shooting at a NMLRA bull's-eye paper target (TG2416) affixed to a life-size buffalo target holder from the 200 yard line under the shelter.
- **300 Yard Open Rifle Caliber:** 10 Rounds. Shooting sticks are allowed. You may use any SASS legal rifle caliber rifle. You may shoot either smokeless or black powder. You will be shooting at a CSF high power large bull's-eye affixed to a life-size buffalo target holder from the 300 yard line that will be located on the rise behind the 200 yard shelter. This is an unimproved dirt area.
- Prone shooting may be allowed. We are waiting on a final determination.
